The View From Here: Hidden Hunger, Sacramento, CA, 2014 - 2015

Devised and directed community engagement initiative involving public radio journalists and four diverse anti-hunger coalitions for multiplatform documentary project on food insecurity. Established partnerships, created mobile storybooth, produced the HiddenHungerStorybooth.com interactive website and resource materials, and orchestrated a series of large, high profile public conversation events sparked by project stories and images. capradioview.org/hunger

Troubled Waters: Tracing Waste in the Delaware River, Philadelphia, PA, 2014
